

- President Rick Van Pelt received the Rotary International Presidential Citation Award.
- The board of directors held the shrimp feed, our annual club assembly.
- Membership development committee introduced 15 new members and ended the year with 229 members.
- Family of Rotary committee presented Lend-a-Hand awards to deserving members and hosted two table mixers to encourage members to interact and get to know one another better.
- Fellowship committee hosted a holiday party, a new golf tournament,
 Golf'toberfest, raising over \$10,000 for charity, and a float trip.
- GYM committee hosted five Get Your Make-Up events, one in conjunction with the Special Olympics basketball tournament.
- Welcoming committee held monthly new member lunches to better acclimate new members into the club.
- Public relations committee published a bio of every new member on the club Facebook page and on the club website.
- Southeast co-sponsored, along with the other Springfield Rotary clubs and the Rotaract club, a joint luncheon on May 11. The speaker was Julie Mulligan, a Rotarian taken captive while on a Rotary exchange.

2015-2016 Community Service

- Southeast provided leadership for the 17th Annual Rock'n Ribs BBQ
 Festival to benefit 7 Springfield area children's charities. The 2016 total is still being calculated, but the 16-year total donations exceeds \$1,600,000.00
- Basketball tournament committee co-sponsored the 29th Annual Rotary Basketball Tournament and raised \$12,119.94 for Special Olympics.
- Southeast members participated in the 20th Annual Miracle of Giving Blood Drive, with over 70 members donating blood, and winning the competition among Rotary clubs.
- Community grants committee awarded \$10,000 to the following organizations and projects:
 - Ozarks Regional YMCA, \$1,000 for kitchen equipment for the Fairbanks community gardens project.
 - Springfield Regional Arts Council, \$1,000 for supplies for taking its Arts in the Parks program to the Title 1 neighborhoods.
 - Girls on the Run: \$1,000
 - Oxford Healthcare: \$1,000
 - Rare Breed: \$1,000
 - Discovery Center, \$1,000 for admission for students on free and reduced lunches.
 - Midwest Foster Care and Adoption, \$1,000 for purchasing meals for parents participating in monthly training sessions.
 - National Alliance on Mental Illness, \$1,000 for producing its resources guide (print and digitally as much as possible).
- Don't Meth With Us made/sponsored presentations to nearly 40 different elementary schools reaching fifth graders, along with Glendale and Parkview Interact Clubs presented the seventh grade program to middle schools, approximately 60 presentations. Hosted David Parnell to present to 13 area high schools and community groups. Extended DMWU to the Branson/Hollister and Clinton areas with conversations beginning in Lebanon and Chillicothe. DMWU presentations have been made to over 33,000 students since the anti-meth program began.
- K-Park committee applied for and received a Rotary District Simplified Grant for \$8,400.00 to be used toward the purchase of a shade sail system to cover the picnic pod and purchased the additional picnic tables for the park.

2015-2016 International Service

 Rotary Foundation committee increased the number of Paul Harris Fellows by 9 and PHF+ members by 32 for an all-time club total of 159.

- Southeast members gave \$38,529 to the Rotary Foundation. Total all-time giving to the Rotary Foundation was over \$902,715. The club has a 97% give rate to EREY.
- Benefactor Endowment committee added one Benefactor to the Permanent Fund for a club total of 75.
- World community service committee disbursed \$15,220 in world community service grants to the following projects:
 - The Messiah Project, donation amount \$3,200.
 - Rotary of Jefferson City, Panama water purification, donation amount \$2,000.
 - Well Aware, sustainable clean water project Daaba, Kenya, donation amount \$1.500.
 - Convoy of Hope Women's Empowerment, micro loans and teaching women a business/trade, donation amount \$2,000.
 - Askinozie Chocolate University, Mababu, Tanzania, educates a local student on business and community involvement while helping a village in Kyela region of Tanzania, donation amount \$2,020.
 - Drury Non-Profit Center, conduct a 2-day leadership workshop for teachers in Eleuthera, a small poverty-stricken island in Bahamas, donation amount \$2,500.
 - World Serve, money for solar panels to make a water well project sustainable, donation amount \$1,000.
 - Fort McMurray Fire Relief Fund, fire relief in Canada, Julie Mulligan, donation amount \$1,000.
- Polio Plus committee conducted a weekly raffle to benefit the Polio Plus Fund of the Rotary Foundation. Total contributions were \$3,485.75 from the raffle.
- Twin Club committee received \$2,000 from the budget for Tlaquepaque, Mexico, in 2015-2016.

2015-2016 New Generations

- RYLA committee selected and sponsored two high school students to attend the Rotary Youth Leadership Academy (RYLA) at William Woods University in Fulton, Missouri.
- Scholarship committee continued Southeast's history of leadership in Springfield by forming a citywide Rotary Global Scholarship committee.
 Successfully recruited members from every Springfield Rotary club and the Rotaract club.
- Student guest committee hosted and recognized 32 high achieving senior student guests from 5 local public and 4 private high schools. On graduates day, honored high school students who were children or grandchildren of members.
- Interact committee continued our relationship with the Interact club at Parkview High School and the Interact club at Glendale High School.
- Rotaract committee remained close with the Springfield Rotaract Club, sending regular visitors to meetings. The club, which was started by Southeast Rotary, won the Presidential Citation award this year, which is a rare feat for Rotaract clubs.

In 2016, the Rotary Club of Springfield Southeast established the Rotary Club of Springfield Southeast Endowment, Inc. The Endowment is a 501(c)(3) and has a separate board.
